Objective 2:

Facilitate communication among professionals in the International Emergency Medicine community to foster collaboration and to disseminate knowledge about various and ongoing initiatives

Objective 3:

Assess the challenges associated with addressing mental health problems in low- and middle-income countries to develop strategies that will help overcome these challenges.

Objective 4:

Define appropriate disaster preparedness plans and operations, and recognize possible opportunities for collaboration.
